




A SIGNIFICANT RETIREMENT

INTRODUCING OUR NEW CEO

Born and raised in Ghana, West Africa, Isaac Quist has enjoyed a long, extensive, and rich career as an educator. His work in education began in 1985 when he was appointed as a teacher of English at Achimota School in Accra.

Isaac's experience as a classroom teacher spans a variety of national and international school contexts including Achimota School, the Ghana International School (GIS), the SOS-Hermann Gmeiner International College (HGIC), and the University of Ghana. He has also taught at Wesley College Melbourne and at the University of Melbourne, in Australia. Alongside his formal classroom teaching, Isaac has also facilitated professional learning workshops for staff of a number of national and multinational firms located in Ghana.

Isaac comes to Alsyd with deep experience of educational leadership in Ghana and elsewhere. In Ghana he has held leadership positions across a broad diversity of roles including: Housemaster (Achimota School), Deputy Senior Housemaster and Head of English (SOS-Hermann Gmeiner International College), Examiner/Acting Chief Examiner and Examination paper-setter/Moderator for the West African Examinations' Council (WAEC), Textbook reviewer and Trainer of trainers in support of Ghana's educational reforms in 1989-1990. From participation in examining 1991. his and curriculum development activities took on a distinctly international dimension when he started supporting the work of the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO), first as an examiner and, subsequently, as a curriculum reviewer.



ISAAC QUIST

At the start of 1998, Isaac relocated to Cardiff, Wales, in the UK, to work directly, and fully, for the IB, initially as a Subject Area Manager for all the language courses of the IB Diploma He Programme. subsequently was. promoted to the position of Curriculum Area for Manager Languages Internationalism. In this role, Isaac had direct oversight responsibility for the ongoing review, development, and implementation of the IB's language programs world-wide. The role entailed deep and sustained professional engagement with academics, researchers, curriculum and assessment experts, schools, leaders. teachers. school examiners. workshop leaders globally and from diverse cultural and linguistic contexts, and traditions.



INTRODUCING OUR NEW CEO

Between 2006 to 2022, Isaac was based at Wesley College Melbourne in Australia, where he held diverse roles in curriculum leadership, culminating in the position of Executive Director for Curriculum and International Strategy. In addition to directing Wesley's implementation of the IB's curriculum programmes, Isaac was also instrumental to the creation and implementation of new frameworks for learning such as Wesley's Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP). He also shaped and directed Wesley's international partnerships for learning with a variety of schools around the world, from countries such as China, Colombia, France, Germany, Japan, Spain, and Thailand.

Prior to taking up the role of CEO at Alsyd Academy, Isaac initiated the establishment and operation of the NuBuED Group, comprising:

- NuBuED IMMERSE which aspires to create, offer, and support schools and school communities with a range of immersive learning programs targeted towards:
 - enhancing the quality of teaching and learning in K-12 education in Ghana and elsewhere
 - equipping young people with a detailed understanding of how the world works and supporting them to develop the competencies needed to harness its opportunities and, also, navigate its challenges

Additionally, Isaac continues to operate as an educational consultant who works with interested schools worldwide to adopt and implement international curriculum programmes. He also undertakes curriculum development and broader educational consultancy for a variety of institutions in Ghana and elsewhere.

Isaac currently serves as a director/board member for a number of educational institutions and organizations, including the Global Connections Network of schools.




HIGHLIGHTS














REMINDERS CONT.


